



Prepare:

Build:

Enter your scarecrow:

Email your submission to Kate no later than the evening of **Saturday**, **Sept. 19th**. Include:

- a short video (less than 30 second long) showing all sides of the scarecrow, & telling us its name and who worked on it
- a good still photo showing the whole front of your scarecrow

Important Details:

- Host Families are invited to join! Get them involved in building the scarecrow, and invite them to log on with you for the Sept. 20th Zoom Meeting.
- Each Au Pair's group will get one vote for the contest.
- You cannot vote for yourself!
- Each scarecrow must be at least 2 feet tall, but life-sized is better.
- Each scarecrow must be homemade!

- Yes! You can join us on Sept. 20th and vote even if you don't submit a scarecrow.

Where to get materials:
